**SUBJECT:** Correspondence Received Regarding the Proposed Football Stadium as of May 31, 2008

For the period of February 26 through May 31, 2008, the Mayor and Council Offices, City Manager's Office and other City departments and municipal addresses have received 137 additional emails, phone messages, and letters from residents or others regarding the proposal for a 49ers football stadium. I am opposed to the proposed 49er football stadium that Santa Clara is currently studying. Although there is much potential for this stadium to generate much needed revenue for our city, I believe there are significant risks that outweigh the benefits of a stadium. First, the city government cannot guarantee that city funds or its citizens' taxes will never be used to pay for the upkeep or maintenance of such a stadium. Second, the city government faces a great and permanent burden if a stadium were to be built. Although the city will not be responsible for the management of the stadium, it will need to create a sports authority that will need to manage the stadium. The city, therefore, will have some responsibility in overseeing the sports authority, which will require the city to invest more time, personnel, and money. Third, on days the stadium is scheduled to host a game or other event, hundreds of vehicles and thousands of people will descend on Santa Clara. Santa

Clara will have to increase its police force to manage traffic and patrol the neighborhoods adjacent to the stadium. A stadium will create massive traffic congestion that will adversely affect our quality of life. Already the neighborhoods surrounding Great America are affected by the amusement park traffic. Imagine the massive traffic and air and noise pollution on a day when Great America and the stadium are open on the same day! Do we want to accept such hardships in our daily lives just to increase our city's revenue? Dear Ms. Tomlinson:

Your email to the Mayor and City Council was referred to the City Manager's Office for a response.

Regarding the 49ers proposal for a football stadium on City-owned land, you asked if a stadium were approved and built, and then years later, the team wanted to move to another jurisdiction, what would the City of Santa Clara then do with the stadium. That is certainly an important issue. One of the key provisions in negotiations with the 49ers football team will be to determine the potential length of a lease for stadium occupancy, and to outline provisions to ensure occupancy for that set period of time. This could be outlined in a Term Sheet which is currently being worked on over the next four to six months. The Term Sheet will outline the results of the preliminary negotiations that are currently underway, to further examine issues, and clarify and document understandings and guarantees of all parties involved in the proposed potential football stadium project. The Term Sheet would return to the Council for review and further public discussion. Another item likely to be included in the negotiations would be what would happen to the stadium at the end of the set occupancy period. For example, if the stadium were to be built and occupied for a specified length of time, at the end of the time period if the team moved, what would be the process and who would be responsible for paying for potentially clearing the older and potentially out-dated stadium off the property, to make the property ready for other potential use(s).

You also expressed concern about potential property values if the stadium were to be built in Santa Clara, as well as concerns about noise, traffic, parking issues, and more. Concurrent with the work on the Term Sheet, the 49ers will begin the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) process, including an Environmental Impact Report (EIR). While the EIR would not specifically include information about property values, the EIR would include many of the elements you mention, including noise, parking and traffic issues. Regarding property values, the EIR will discuss the property zoning. The parking lot land and the area where the stadium is proposed to be constructed is zoned for Tourist Commercial, and has had this same General Plan zoning for

many years. Stadium use would conform with the current zoning. Specific information on potential impacts to property values is not available.

For clarification, the current negotiations are preliminary and non-binding. They do not commit the City to the stadium project. Many issues remain to be clarified and discussed, and future decisions considered, at upcoming City Council meetings. Should the decision be to continue to move forward in considering the proposed stadium project, Council has expressed that elements of a Term Sheet could serve as the basis for potential ballot measure language, possibly for the November 2008 ballot. Council discussed the type and timing of a potential ballot measure at the Council meeting of Jan. 22, 2008, but asked for staff to develop additional information. This will be coming back to the City Council on March 4, 2007 for discussion at that Council meeting.

Ms. Tomlinson, your email was conveyed to the Mayor and City Council on the day that it was received, and has also been copied to the City Manager. Your concerns have been noted, and your email will also be placed into the public record of discussion on this proposal by the 49ers for the football stadium. Thank you for taking the time to convey your concerns and comments to the City.



1. There should be absolutely no guarantees or financial input from the City of Santa Clara. The 49ers, like all professional sports teams, are very wealthy and can afford to pay all their own way with no financial help or incentives from the taxpayers of Santa Clara.
2. According to the 49ers proposal, Agnew and Lafayette WILL NOT be OFF-LIMITS nor closed to parking on game days. Agnew, in particular should be closed between Lafayette and Mission College on game/event days and evenings (open to local traffic only on game days/evenings). Agnew is a busy residential area with many stop signs and a park and a natural throughway from Lafayette to the 101. Traffic should be directed to Montague or the 237 on game days.

The goal is to complete a Term Sheet that clearly outlines the understandings and guarantees of all parties. Should the stadium move forward, such issues as parking and traffic would have to be fully examined as part of the CEQA/Environmental Impact Report process. This would include studying traffic flows on those streets that you referenced, as well as other streets.

The third and fourth points of your email are regarding access to San Tomas Aquino/Saratoga Creek Trail, and we agree that the trail could provide access for stadium use, for football games or other potential stadium use, that trail access could be augmented, and the trail should be protected from potential damage that might occur during a construction project of this type, or any other type, in the vicinity.

Your comments will be added to the public record of discussion on the stadium project as consideration continues on this issue. Thank you, Mr. Redfield, for taking time to write to the City with your detailed comments, and project suggestions and concerns.
