Subject: Building Search (Slow Search) with K9 and K9 apprehension

Items discussed and taught on 3/29/20:

Searching with K9: Discussion with search team prior to beginning search in regard to roles and responsibilities while using K9. The K9 handler will chose position in the stick and may need a clear line of sight on their K9 when they are being used for a search.

Initial Search: The dog will be sent into the structure on/off leash and allowed to roam free in order to search for and locate subject. Below is a list of common occurrences when using a K9 for searching.

Dog does NOT find the suspect:

Continue to systematically clear the structure until the suspect is located and taken into custody.

- It is important that officers are not lulled into a false sense of confidence because the K9 did not find anything. They must treat each room like someone is inside waiting for them.

Dog finds suspect and is on the bite:

- The suspect will be given commands by the K9 officer to bring the dog to them.
 - **The suspect brings the dog:** Once the suspect is in sight the dog will be recalled by the K9 handler. Once the K9 handler has positive control of his K9, the suspect will be given commands and taken into custody.
 - **The suspect refuses to bring the dog:** The team will continue to systematically search the rooms in between the search / arrest team and the suspect location. Once the team moves close enough to location of the suspect they will set up a strong hold. Once the strong hold is set and the arrest team is set. The team will move in and apprehend suspect with predetermined roles (see below) or the K9 operator will re-call their dog. Once the K9 handler has positive control of their K9 the arrest team will take the suspect into custody preferably by making them move towards your position of cover. However, if the suspect loses consciousness or is unable to move the team may need to advance to take the suspect into custody.

Dog finds alerts on a closed door: While searching the K9 may alert on a closed door. The dog should be put into the down position and hold on that door until the search team can search all of the rooms between the team and the dog. Once the team arrives at that door, the door should be opened and the K9 should be re-deployed into that room.

Arrest team: The arrest team should consist of:

- Lethal coverage on the suspect
- Lethal coverage beyond the suspect
- Voice command
- Less lethal = Taser / 40mm / Pepperball
- Hands

The above training was administered at 3555 Patrick Henry Drive. The training lasted about 2 hour (2000 hours to 2200 hours). See attached orange card for attendees.
