This is a summary of the City of Santa Clara's latest response efforts along with impacts to local events and City programs/services due to the coronavirus (COVID-19) public health emergency.

Current Developments

- The Santa Clara Convention Center is undergoing a deep cleaning after serving as the temporary site for a State of California-run Federal Medical Station (FMS) for the past month.
 - The FMS, which assisted local hospitals by serving low acuity COVID-19 patients, is nearly demobilized with the removal and packing of equipment while the City of Santa Clara-owned facility undergoes an extensive and thorough cleaning.
 - From April 5-28, 2020, a total of 20 patients were treated at the FMS.
 - The State as well as the County of Santa Clara were involved in the decision to demobilize the FMS.
 - The City is continuing to follow the public health order and, when it is appropriate, the Convention Center will return to normal operations.

- For individuals who do not have the above access, the City Cafeteria has been set up to accommodate up to 10 people at a time and public comment will be given from that location.
- With the heightened “Stay at Home” order by the State and the continued order by the County, the Mayor will be present for the meeting with Councilmembers and department heads participating remotely. A limited number of staff will also be present. The meeting set-up is in line with the recommendations of the COVID-19 White House Task Force, which notes no more than 10 people gatherings.
