## COVID-19 Update (May 29, 2020, 1 p.m.)

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This is a summary of the City of Santa Clara's latest response efforts along with impacts to local events and City programs/services due to the coronavirus (COVID-19) public health emergency.

### Current Developments

- The [County of Santa Clara's Shelter-in-Place order](#), that went into effect one week ago on Friday, May 22, allows retailers in the county to open for curbside/outdoor pickup.
  - The amended public health order signifies Santa Clara County's entry into early Phase 2 of reopening.
  - It allows additional outdoor activities to resume, including car parades, outdoor museums, historical sites and publicly accessible gardens.
  - The May 22 order also updates the health and safety protocols that all businesses are required to follow if open.
  - The County requires face coverings whenever at a business and when using public transit.
    - Face coverings are not required while exercising outdoors but should be readily available if you need to put one on.

  - The County's current order is on-going, without an end date, until further notice.
- The City's Health & Wellness Fair, which usually takes place at the Santa Clara Senior Center, is being held virtually, starting Friday, May 29.

## **City Programs and Services**

### **Mission City Memorial Park**

- The City will open Mission City Memorial Park (MCMP) for visitor hours on Tuesday and Thursday mornings from 9 a.m. to 12 p.m. starting Tuesday, June 2, 2020.
- In compliance with the County public health order, the City will manage the total number of visitors allowed in MCMP at one time to 100 individuals to reduce crowding and risk of virus transmission.
- Visitors are asked to wear face covering and abide by at least a six-foot social distancing, as well as to bring hand sanitizer and wipes for personal use.
- Vehicle and pedestrian access will be limited to the Dolores Avenue entrance where visitors will be greeted at the gate by staff and provided with cemetery rules. Staff will be monitoring social distancing inside park.

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
