



## CITY MANAGER BIWEEKLY REPORT

JULY 25 – AUG. 7, 2020

### GENERAL INFORMATION

**Safety First at Annual Cleanup Campaign:** After a delay due to COVID-19, the Annual Cleanup Campaign kicks off on Monday, Aug. 10. City staff coordinated with Mission Trail Waste Systems to review best practices in the solid waste industry and to implement applicable safety protocols and procedures. There are many new safety protocols in place to ensure the health and safety of our staff. The City has increased staffing levels to help mitigate delays and ensure the event occurs safely and successfully. Enhanced safety procedures may cause service delays in some areas, but rest assured, the Cleanup will get done. Some new protocols include:

- Crews will disinfect items that must be hand loaded with a spray solution of 1/3 cup bleach per 1 gallon of water prior to removal.
- The crews will maintain physical distancing, wear masks and other personal protective equipment (PPE).
- Crews will be able to disinfect items quicker if residents separate appliances and electronic waste from the main pile.

The City appreciates your patience while every effort is made to complete the Annual Cleanup Campaign safely for both staff and residents. **Solid Waste Rates Approved:** On July 29, the Office of the City Manager released a [community letter](#) to summarize information on the new solid waste rates and financial assistance program.

At the July 14 meeting, the City Council approved new solid waste rates, including the residential rates shown below that reflect the increased costs of new agreements with Mission Trail Waste Systems, GreenWaste Recovery and Recology. The increase in the adopted rates is attributed to the higher costs associated with disposing of recyclables due to overseas China

recycling restrictions, disposing of organic materials in compliance with Senate Bill 1383 and operational costs in the solid waste industry outpacing the cost of living adjustments in previous agreements. In order to comply with SB 1383 requirements, the City is implementing mixed waste processing, which will remove organic materials from garbage without the need for sorting by the residents.

\*Bundled rates include the monthly charges for garbage, yard waste, Clean-up Campaign, residential recycling and household hazardous waste.

The new rates became effective on Aug. 1, 2020 and can be viewed at [SantaClaraCA.gov/CleanSC](http://SantaClaraCA.gov/CleanSC). The Council also approved the use of the Solid Waste Rate Stabilization Reserve funds to provide all residential and commercial business customer accounts with a \$3 per month reduction to their solid waste utility bill for six months to smooth the transition to the higher rates. **Water & Sewer Rate Assistance:** Water & Sewer Utilities, in collaboration with Silicon Valley Power and the Department of Public Works, is providing rate assistance to residential customers that qualify as low-income households. Water and sewer rates are being discounted 25% for qualifying customers. Water rates, currently \$6.43 per HCF (hundred cubic feet), will be discounted for no more than 12 HCF of usage and the flat residential sewer rate of \$44.53 will be discounted 25% as well. For a residential customer using 12 HCF of water, a water and sewer bill that would have been \$121.69 will be discounted to \$91.27 per month. **2020 Annual Street Maintenance and Rehabilitation Project:** Beginning on Aug. 3, the City's contractor, DeSilva Gates Construction, began construction activities as part of the 2020 Annual Street Maintenance and Rehabilitation Project. This project is in addition to the other pavement project happening this summer on Homestead Road and Scott Boulevard. This additional project consists of removal and replacement of failed pavement areas, application of slurry seal surface treatments, installation of rubberized asphalt, replacement of pavement markings, and construction of new ADA-compliant curb ramps. Replacement of failed pavement areas will begin late August and will continue through October with final project completion anticipated in December 2020. 
**Call Before You Dig:** August 11 is National Safe Digging Day! Silicon Valley Power would like to remind everyone to call 8-1-1 before digging so that all underground utilities can be located and marked. This will help avoid unintentionally digging into an underground water or power line, keep you safe and avoid an unintentional power outage. If you plan to install a fence or

**Chief's Advisory Committee Meeting:** The Chief's Advisory Committee met on July 27. The advisory group discussed the Police Department's new organizational structure, the City's budget situation as a result of COVID-19, and the City Council's recent action to form a Commitment to Action Ad Hoc Committee led by Mayor Lisa M. **Census Workers to Visit Households for 2020 Census:** Starting Aug. 11, census takers will begin visiting households that have not yet responded to the 2020 Census. The U.S. Census Bureau has adjusted operations in order to protect the health and safety of staff and the public, and census takers will follow health guidelines and wear protective personal equipment, such as face coverings.



Official census takers visiting households will:

- Wear a mask and conduct all interviews from outside the home.
- Visit households between 9 a.m. and 9 p.m., including on weekends when people are most likely to be home.
- Have an I.D. badge with their photograph, a U.S. Department of Commerce watermark and an expiration date.
- Use a Census Bureau-issued phone and carry a bag with the Census Bureau logo.

Anyone wishing to verify a census worker in your neighborhood can call 213-314-6500. If the Census worker who knocks on your door doesn't speak your language, you can request a return visit from one who does.

The deadline to respond to the 2020 Census has been extended to **Oct. 31, 2020** and households can respond online at [my2020census.gov](https://my2020census.gov) or by calling 844-330-2020 to respond by phone. ### **CITY COVID-19 UPDATES**

The City of Santa Clara continues to closely monitor the coronavirus (COVID-19) situation. The following section includes status updates for events, programs and City services. **Free COVID-19 Testing Pop-Ups in Santa Clara:** For the upcoming free COVID-19 testing in Santa Clara, an appointment will be required. In partnership with the County of Santa Clara Department of Public Health, the City of Santa Clara will host the appointment-only **COVID-19 testing at Central Park Library, 2635 Homestead Road, on Aug. 12, Aug. 26, Sept. 23 and Sept. 30 from 9:30 a.m. to 4 p.m.** The testing site is for people without COVID-19 symptoms. Registration opens starting Sunday, Aug. 9, details are on the City website at

**Proposed Eviction Moratorium Extension:** On March 24, 2020, the City Council adopted an Urgency Ordinance, setting in place a moratorium on evictions in the City of Santa Clara for the non-payment of rent and no-fault evictions for tenants affected by COVID-19. The moratorium has since been extended multiple times with the latest extension on June 23, 2020 where the City Council authorized the extension of the moratorium currently through Aug. 31, 2020.

In July, Governor Gavin Newsom extended the executive order that allows cities to suspend evictions for renters and homeowners through the end of September. At the Aug. 18, 2020 meeting, the City Council will consider a resolution to extend the moratorium for an additional 30 days through the end of September 2020.

**COVID-19 Compliant Outdoor Operations:** The City of Santa Clara took another step to support local business during the pandemic. On July 28, the City Manager, acting as the Director of Emergency Services, issued direction to the Community Development Department allowing the outdoor operation of salons and recreational uses in compliance with State and County health safety protocols. The City Manager's direction also allows for the opening of a drive-through COVID-19 testing clinic at the Kaiser Permanente Santa Clara Medical Center. Businesses seeking to operate outdoor salon and recreational activities should contact the Planning Division to obtain a free Permit to verify that the use conforms with State, County and City requirements. The free Outdoor Commercial Activity Permit application and additional information is [available on the website](#).

**Senior Swim and Lap Swim Return at International Swim Center:** The City resumed Senior Swim and Lap Swim operations at the International Swim Center on Friday, Aug. 7 in accordance with [County guidelines](#). Lap swimming will be available on a reservation basis only through [Sign-Up Genius](#) or by calling the Community Recreation Center at 408-615-3140. **Over 200,000 Meals Distributed during COVID-19 Response:** Through the Healthy Meals Santa Clara program for youth and the program for seniors, the City of Santa Clara and its partners have distributed over 200,000 meals over the course of 21 weeks of operation to ensure that Santa Clara's most vulnerable residents did not go hungry over the weekends.

### **LEVI'S STADIUM RELATED UPDATES**

**Community Letter Regarding Stadium Authority Fiscal Update & Measure J Non-Compliance:** On July 27, Stadium Authority Executive Director Deanna J. Santana provided a community letter with recent information received from the 49ers (acting as the Stadium Manager) about the Stadium Authority's year-end financial report, including the 49ers' failure to comply with Measure J by not paying \$1.1 million for public safety services to the City. The Stadium Authority will continue to update the community of the 49ers' poor fiscal performance and their compliance with Measure J. [View the community letter](#) for more details.

**National Football League Cancels Pre-Season:** On July 27, 2020, National Football League Commissioner Roger Goodell formally announced that there will be no preseason games in 2020 following an agreement reached with the NFL Players Association. As a result, the Aug. 21 (vs Las Vegas Raiders) and Sept. 3 (vs San Diego Chargers) games will not be played at Levi's® Stadium. The first league home game is scheduled for Sunday, Sept. 13 at 1:25 p.m. vs the Arizona Cardinals.

The May 7, 2020 State of California [public health order](#) indicates public events and large gatherings are not allowed. Based on Governor's Newsom's [Resilience Road Map](#) which allows the state to move forward towards modifying the state order, Stage 4 (final stage) concerns the reopening of areas of highest risk; e.g. concerts, conventions, sports arenas. At this time, it is unknown whether the 2020 NFL season will have attendees at the home games.

#### **Tasman East Specific Plan Virtual Community Meeting:**

On Aug. 10 at 5 p.m., join the virtual community meeting on the Tasman East Specific Plan. The City is preparing an amendment to the Tasman East Specific Plan (Specific Plan Amendment #1), which will be considered by the Planning Commission and City Council in the late summer and Fall 2020 timeframe. The amendment proposes to allow the replacement of a street extension, which was proposed through the original Specific Plan, of Calle Del Sol with a pedestrian and bicycle paseo and to allow for additional methods of site-wide transportation measures.
